# Trip Itinerary

*This is a preliminary itinerary*

## Day 1: July 07, 2026; Accra

Arrive in Accra from your overnight flight from the United States. Upon arrival, you will be met and transferred to the hotel. We will meet this evening for dinner.

**\*\*Note:** Overnight flights should depart U.S. on July 12, in order to arrive on July 13.

## Day 2: July 08, 2026; Accra

After breakfast, we will drive to Cape Coast, the capital of the central region of Ghana. We will tour two of the largest slave castles in Ghana and see the "door of no return." After a long day, we will return to the hotel for some time to personally reflect.

## Day 3: July 09, 2026; Accra

After breakfast, we will explore Ghana's capital city, including historical monuments, Kwame Nkrumah Memorial Park and Independence Square, learning about West Africa's first country to gain independence. After lunch we will do some shopping in a local artists' market and we will learn the craft of fabric dying.

## Day 4: July 10, 2026; Keta

After check out this morning, we will head to Keta, a beach town in the Ewe region of Ghana. We will tour Keta, including visiting a known lighthouse and Fort Prinzenstein, a key prison and transport point before enslaved Africans were taken to the Virgin Islands. After checking into our hotel, we will have some time to relax and enjoy the local beach.



## Day 5: July 11, 2026; Keta

Experience the vibrant culture of the Volta Region with a traditional Ewe naming ceremony celebrating life and identity. Participants will each receive an Ewe name as part of this joyful tradition. We will join local drummers and dancers as rhythmic beats fill the air, with the option of taking part in an interactive workshop to learn the movements and rhythms ourselves.

## Day 6: July 12, 2026; Keta

Travel deeper into Ghana's cultural heart with a visit to a traditional Kente weaving center, where you'll learn how the iconic cloth is made and try your hand at the loom alongside skilled artisans. Continue to the Tafi Atome Monkey Sanctuary to meet the friendly Mona monkeys that live in harmony with the local community.

## Day 7: July 13, 2026; Accra

Begin the day with a guided tour through one of Accra's bustling markets, where you can shop for colorful fabrics, handmade crafts, and local delicacies. Continue to the W.E.B. Du Bois Center, a historic site honoring the life and legacy of the renowned Pan-African scholar. In the evening, you have the option to unwind and celebrate your journey with a taste of Ghanaian nightlife or relax at the hotel
